It has a mainly plastic construction, though its wand is metal. It doesn't feel especially sturdy overall, particularly its fragile dirt compartment. Thankfully, the vacuum itself is easy to assemble and disassemble and disasse not all of them are easy to access. Dirt compartment: You can empty the dirt compartment from the bottom by pressing on the unlock button. It should clean regularly. Brushroll: The brushroll: The brushroll can't be removed. That said, you can still get better access to it by using a coin, flathead screwdriver, or anything similar to lift the brushroll cover.
